ORDINANCE NO/2010

1. Short title and Commencement

(a) This ORDINANCE shall be known as 'BBA, LL B (Trimester) Ordinance 2010'. These Rules shall govern all aspects of BBA LL B (Honours) Academic Programme at the MATS Law School, MATS University, Raipur (C.G.).

(b) The ordinance shall come in effect forth with.

2. Admissions

(a) The admission in BBA LLB (Honours) shall be open to all those candidates who had passed + 2 examination from any board recognized by C.G Government in any stream with minimum 45% marks in aggregate. However there shall be a relaxation of 05 % of marks for SC ST, Minorities & Woman candidates.

(b) Graduates in any stream may also apply for admission provided they are not more than 20 years of age if of general caste and 22 years of age if belonging to reserve categories as indicated in above category.

(c) The admission shall be taken on the bases of All India Admission Test to be conducted by MATS University in its various centres in the country. The centres will be notified on the web site of the University.

Provided that left out vacancies may be filled at the discretion of Director MATS Law School on merits from among the students who had appeared in CLAT or equivalent examination on the basis of interview.

(e) The University reserves the liberty to refuse admission to any one without assigning any reason in public interest or in the interest of University.

3. Assessment System

(a) The examination shall consist of continuous assessment and the end-term examination. The end-term examination component will be of 60% (external) and continuous assessment (continuous) will be of 40 % marks. The scheme of continuous

assessment shall be designed according to the need of teaching-learning process as required by BCI/UGC/MATS Law College and may be further divided as follows:

Project/Court Room Exercise	-	15 Marks (10 for Memorial/ Assignment
+ 5 for Viva based there on)		
Snap Test/ Home Assignment	-	10 Marks
Mid – Term Examination	-	15 Marks

Provided that if any student submits a copy of article published on the topic of his project, he may be awarded ‘O’ in project work.

Note- Home Assignment may include Case Analysis, Class Presentation, and Home Work etc.

(b) Two sets of question papers, ten days before scheduled examination may be required to be submitted to Director, MATS Law School/Controller of Examination for end term examination by respective faculty/external subject expert. This shall open for moderation.

4. Pass Grade per Semester

(a) For Passing the Examination, a student must secure at least 50% in each subject.

Provided that in 1st, 2nd, 4th, 5th, 7th, 8th, 10th, 11th, 13th and 14th Trimesters all students shall be promoted to the next Trimester irrespective of marks/percentage obtained in a paper/papers.

Provided, further, that in 3rd, 6th, 9th, 12th and 15th Trimester, the candidate shall pass only after clearing any backlog in previous or immediate previous prior thereto.

Provided that, it shall be lawful for the University to hold a repeat examination at the end of 3rd, 6th, 9th, 12th, and 15th Trimester in all subjects for those who have not cleared any paper till 3rd, 6th, 9th, 12th, and 15th Trimester examination which shall be of 60 marks maximum. No repeat examination shall be allowed in continuous assessment valuation.

Provided that except as above there shall be no supplementary examination or revaluation or rechecking in any way what so ever.

Provided further that any candidate who fails even in repeat examination shall be at liberty to appear as ex-student in paper/papers he/she has failed. Such candidates if pass ex- students may be considered for admission in next Trimester as usual. Marks obtained in continuous assessment earlier shall be carried forward in repeat as well as when the candidates takes up his/her examination as an ex-student.

5. Grace Marks

That the grace up to maximum 3 marks in each trimester may be given irrespective of the number of paper/papers where in it is so required after the results of repeat examination for pass only. Grace marks shall be excluded in deciding division/grade/CGPA.

6. Moderation

It shall be open to the director MATS Law School to moderate the results on the recommendation of departmental committee on his satisfaction and in his sole discussion if the result is too good or too bad.

7. Attendance

(a) All students shall attend the classes and other activities organized by the department regularly. A student is required to have a minimum 70 % attendance of the total number of classes including lectures, seminar, tutorials and moot courts etc. held in each of the subjects/courses in a trimester.

Provided that a student who has officially been permitted by MATS Law School to take part in a Moot Court Competition, present a paper in Seminar/Conference/NCC/NSS or activities relating to legal aid clinic may be awarded Deemed Attendance for as many days as may have required for the event and also for the to and fro journey, subject to the approval of the Director, MATS Law School.

Provided that it shall be lawful the Director MATS Law School to consider request of any students for condensation of attendance on medical ground for purpose to appear in the examination.

(b) Five (05) marks may be awarded to the students as **bonus mark** for attendance as detailed below. The attendance and the marks will be provided to Examination Department, who shall add these marks to the total marks in each subject.

8. Grades and Grade Point

The marks secured by the students in individual courses shall be converted into Grades and Grade Points as per the following table.

Provided that the details of total marks obtained/ maximum marks assign to that subject shall be shown in the marks sheet along with grade and grade points calculated accordingly in each subject in separate column.

9. Credit Point

The Credit Point shall be calculated by the examination department in the way detailed below:

Law subjects, Management subjects and Optional Subjects – 8 Credit Points

Honours Course – 10 Credits points

Seminar Course for 13th,14th,15th trimester students – 10 Credits points

10. It shall be open to amend the examination rules in accordance with the procedure for making ordinance.

11. That the provisions of these ordinances shall prevail over any other existing provision if inconsistent with or contrary to what is contained herein.
